Course Description

Middle School Math 3 is a challenging and exciting math course. We will learn the concepts for working with equations and integrating algebraic strategies into problem solving and reasoning. We will stress improving our ability to read, write, listen, and communicate about mathematics, both individually and in cooperative groups. We will incorporate the standards covered on FCAT throughout the year. We will place emphasis on strengthening basic skills by using calculators and mental math skills. Students will apply concepts and skills to real-world problems that reflect our global society. Our ultimate goal is to master the skills, concepts, and strategies that will make all students successful in high school Mathematics.

Homework

Students will be issued a textbook that they are expected to keep at home. Homework must be completed on loose-leaf paper or worksheets that are provided. Unless otherwise stated, all work must be shown. Homework will be checked at the beginning of class on the next school day. Homework missed due to an absence can be obtained through www.edline.net.
