I will expect that you complete your assignments and that you communicate with me if you need assistance. I am here to help you in any way I can; HOWEVER, if I see that you are not putting effort into this class, there will be consequences.

The novels that we will read include the following:

- _ *The Cay* by Theodore Taylor
- _ *The Lawn Boy* by Gary Paulsen
- _ Various Greek Mythology books including *Edith Hamilton's Mythology & Scholastic's Greek Gods and Monsters*.
- _ Three additional choice novels for each quarter's book reports. Students may choose a book that is within the assigned genre for that quarter.

Please keep in mind that every classroom has novels available for children to read and check out. If those books are lost or misplaced, it drastically reduces the number of relevant, readable literature for every student. If a classroom novel is not returned within a timely period, the minimum cost of replacement is \$7; however, if the actual price is available the student's families are responsible for the full cost of the misplaced class novel. Please keep in mind that it is the parent/guardian's responsibility to approve what the student checks out of the classroom libraries as well. Periodically throughout the 2010-2011 school year, your child will be reading novels, watching films, and using equipment here at SSA+S. Some novels and films may have mature content with themes relevant for our students. We provide you with a copy of the novels and please feel free to pre-view the films.

_ TESTS/BOOK REPORTS 35%

All tests & major projects/book reports will be announced approximately one month in advance. If a student will be absent on the due date, you should plan to hand in early, if possible. If a test is missed due to absenteeism, it will be made up the day the student returns to class. Major tests & quizzes that receive a failing grade will require parent/guardian signatures.

_ QUIZZES 30%

If a student is absent and misses a quiz, he or she will also be expected to make up the day they return, unless special circumstances apply.

_ HOMEWORK/CLASSWORK 15%

All homework MUST be neat and on loose-leaf paper. NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOK EDGES PLEASE!! All homework assignments must be completed in blue or black pen, unless otherwise specified. Late homework will be accepted within a reasonable time frame, subject to a grade reduction.

_ BELLWORK 5%

You will complete bell work EVERY DAY when you enter this class. Bell work will be graded and part of your overall grade.
